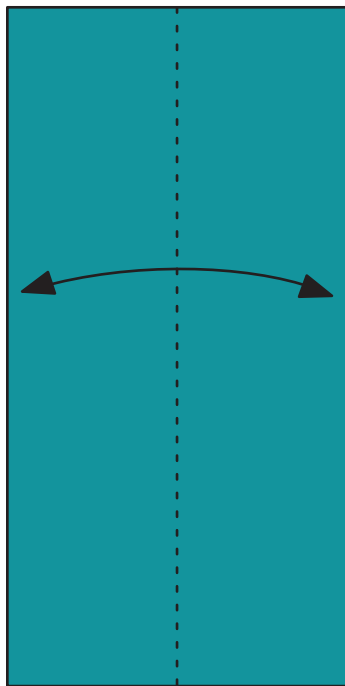

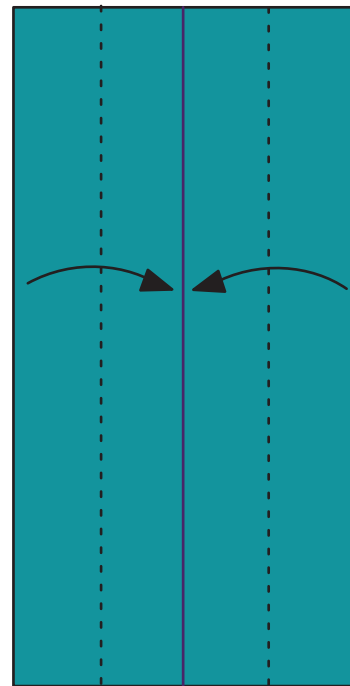
# Music Note steps

USE A PAPER IN THE 2 X 1 PROPORTION



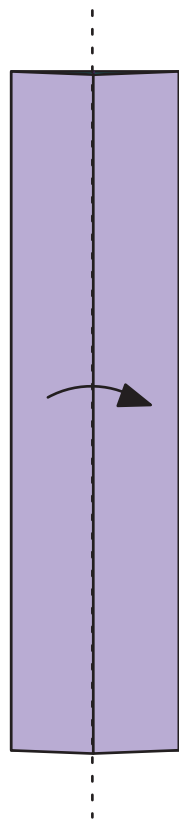
1

1. Fold side to side and unfold.



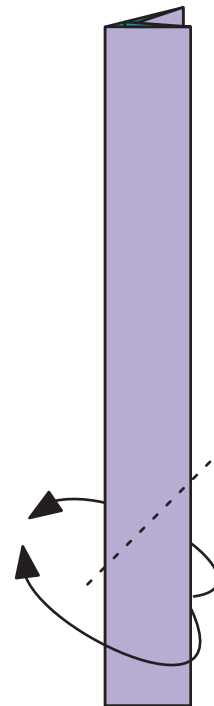

2. Take both sides to the center.



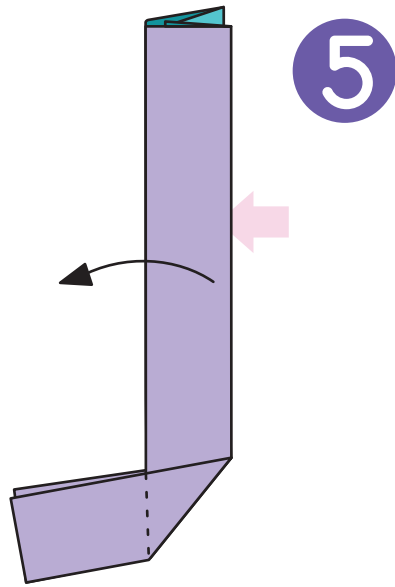

3. Fold the left side over the right.

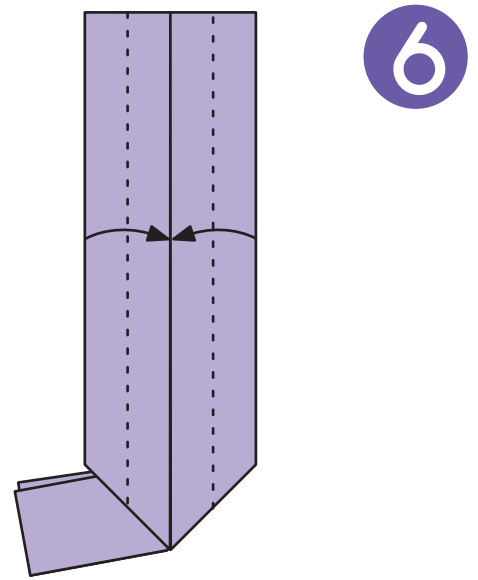

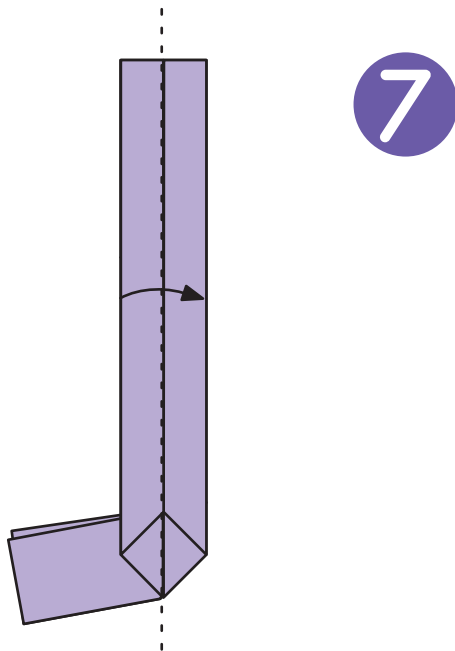
4. Fold the bottom part out, on the dotted line.



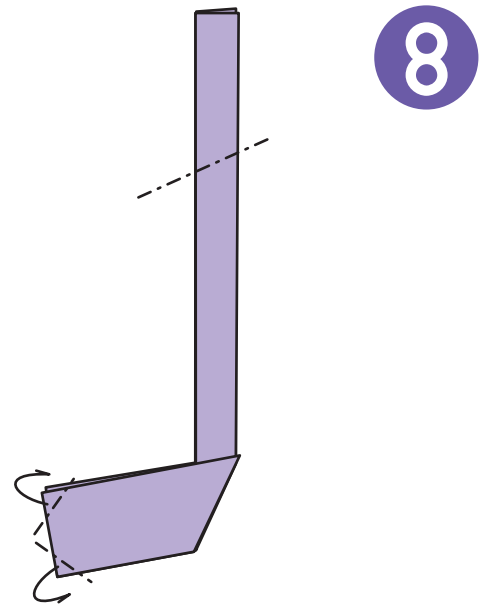
5. Open on the right side.



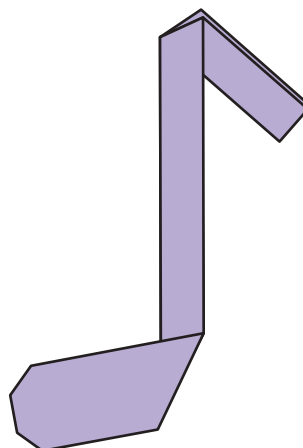
6. Fold the two sides to the center.



7. Fold one side over the other.



8. Fold the corners back.  
Fold the top tip inward.
