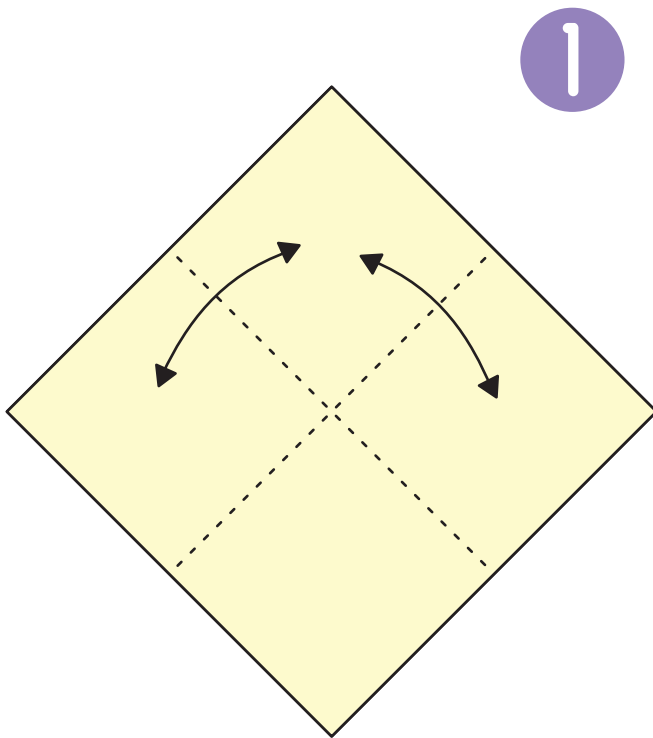

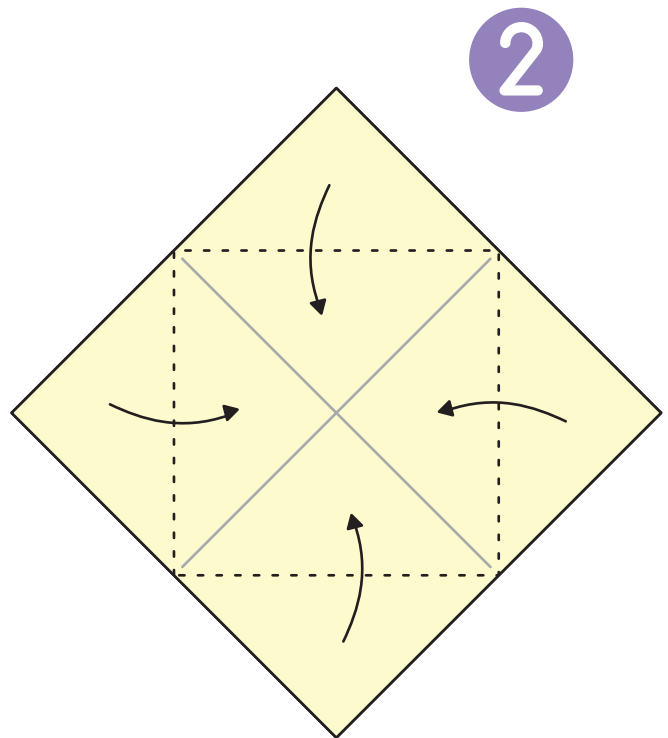

Crown steps

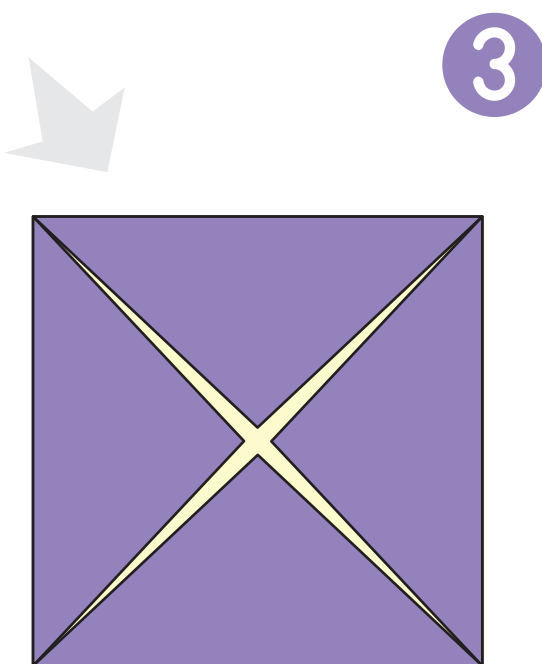
USE A SQUARE OF PAPER



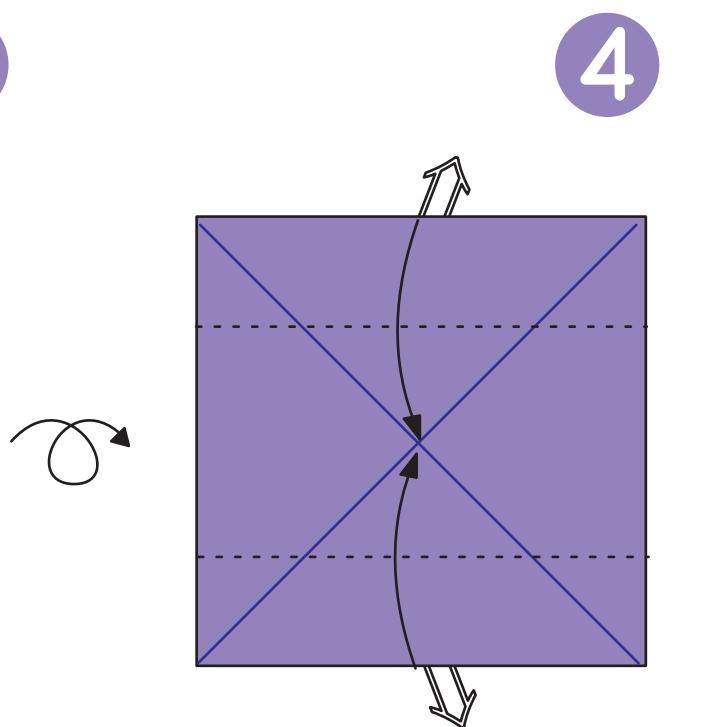
1. Fold side to side and unfold. Do the same on the other sides.



2. Fold the four corners to the center.

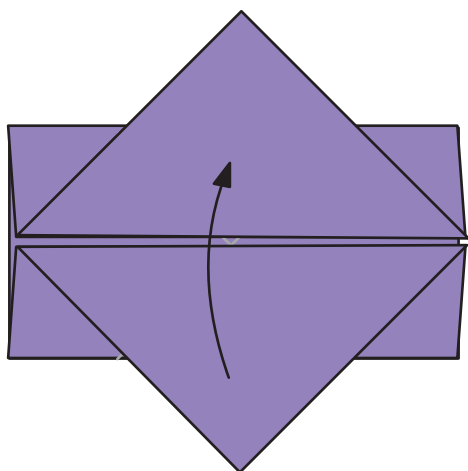


3. The result will be this. Turn the model over.



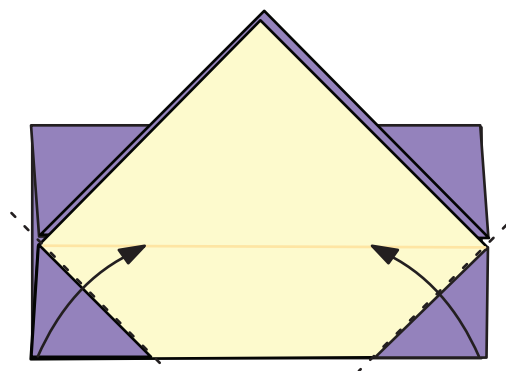
4. Fold the top and bottom inward, while bringing up the down triangles.

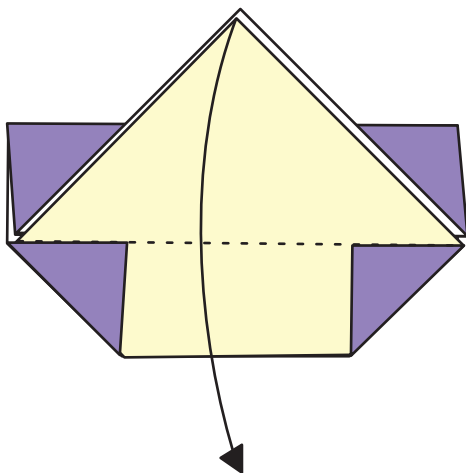
5. Lift the lower triangle.

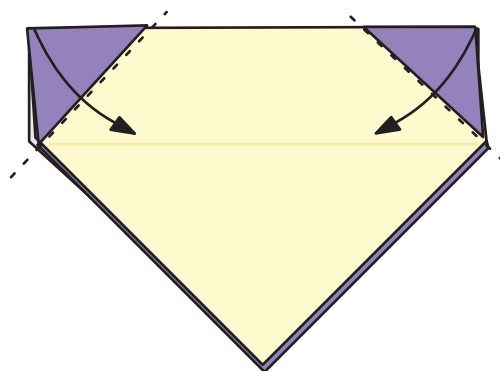
6. Fold the corners.

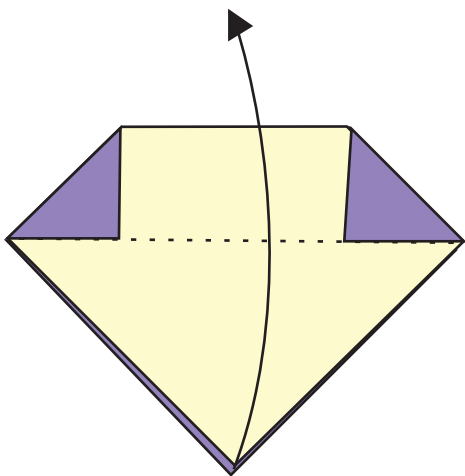
7. Lower the two upper triangles.

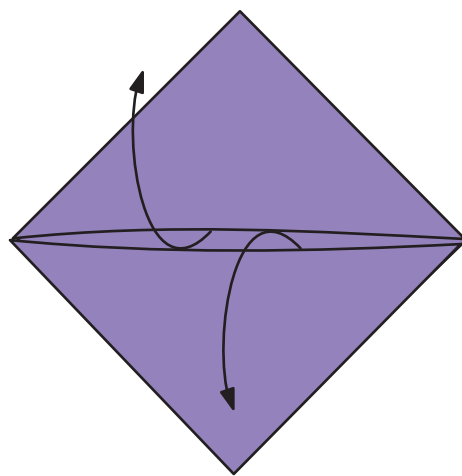
8. Fold the upper corners.

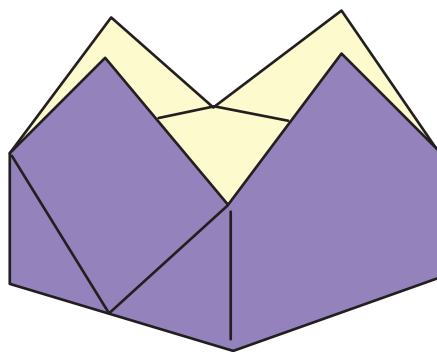


9. Lift the triangle while following the arrow.
